Meeting Highlights

Harold and Fae Audre Rice are both RESC members and 1956 graduates of the University of Kentucky—he with a B.S.EE and she with a B.A. Education.

Their travelling started when Harold was stationed at Tachikawa Air Force Base near Tokyo, Japan for three years. They not only toured Japan, but travelled to the Phillipines, Thailand, Viet Nam, Singapore, and Hong Kong.

Harold is a Registered Professional Engineer in Ohio and Kentucky, is a Director of the Cincinnati Chapter, Ohio Society of Professional Engineers, and is a life member of NSPE, IEEE, and ASQ. He retired from GE Aircraft Engines at Evendale and Fluor Daniel Fernald as a Senior Project Engineer. He is currently on the UK Engineering and National Boards of Directors, and is active in Gideons International, Christ's Church at Mason, and is President of the Mason Christian Village Residents' Association.

Audre has taught high school general science and algebra in Japan, Kentucky, Ohio, Illinois, and Florida, and served with Harold on the OSPE Scholarship Committee. She is active in the Kenwood Womans' Club, serving as Vice President, President as well as Scholarship Chairman.

They have two children: Duane, Principal Product Marketing Manager, MetaFrame Presentation Server, Citrix Systems, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and Darla, Administrator, Product Commercialization, Nestle' USA, Cleveland, Ohio.

Since retirement, they have travelled with the University of Kentucky Alumni Association to Alaska, through the Panama Canal, and cruised down the Danube, visiting the Netherlands, Germany, Austria, Hungary, and the Czech and Slovak Republics. Other interesting trips included meeting Japanese friends in Hawaii, East Coast leaf viewing on the QE2, three weeks on a wildlife tour in Australia and New Zealand, and a grand tour of Italy. They also toured mainland China, Greece, Turkey, and Egypt. In 2000, they toured Switzerland, attended the Oberammergau Passion Play, and toured eastern Canada including Quebec, Montreal, and Ottawa.

Some of their recent trips were to Scandinavia—Sweden, Denmark, and Norway, to Belgium and Holland for the flower shows, and to France, Spain and Portugal. Their last two trips were to Scotland, Wales, and England, and to St. Petersburg and down the river to Moscow in Russia.

They will now take you to “Amazing Russia”.

Tour Highlights

This year J.T.M. celebrates its 24th anniversary. Founded in 1980, J.T.M. is an outgrowth of Jack Maas Meats, a local Cincinnati butcher shop that traces its roots back to the 1960s. When it became apparent to Jack Maas, Sr. in the 1970s that a retail butcher business would not adequately support his growing family and customer needs, he added a small meat-processing plant and diversified into the wholesale market, supplying area restaurants and food-service trades.

Then in 1983, J.T.M. expanded their business again and moved from Delhi, a Cincinnati suburb; to Harrison, Ohio, located on the Ohio / Indiana border.

Since then, the sky has been the limit for J.T.M. With all six of Jack Maas, Sr.'s children, his wife, Jo Ann, and the extended Maas family all taking active roles in the business, the service the customers of Jack Maas Meats received 30 years ago is still enjoyed by today's customers. A smile, a helping hand and the “go the extra mile” attitude are at the heart of J.T.M.

By adding new buildings, equipment and staff, they have been able to continue to meet and exceed the demands of their customers. They feel that they have been blessed with a talented and dedicated group of employees and customers. Without them, they would not be where they are today.

Today, they produce products for the food service industry, retail operations, school food service and the military. Their main marketing area focuses on the midwest and east coast, but they do distribute product nationally as well as worldwide to military commissaries.

After a good lunch (with desert) at Market Street Grille we will proceed to JTM. We will gather at the JTM Cafe prior to starting our tour. JTM makes over 400 different products. These include baked goods, kettle cooked products, sandwich line and the original hoagie steaks and other similar type products.

Message from the Board

There is concern for the immediate future of RESC.

RESC has not operated by a budget. It had ample funding to carry on, but for several years expenditures have been more than collections. Short fall was made up from the treasury which was allowed to shrink from what was thought to be too large a balance. Now, with smaller membership, receipts are smaller, even with the recent dues increase. Luncheons are paid for separately.

Projection of spending for the rest of the season is more than our resources. Even with cuts we now plan the funds will run out. There will be no stake for next season.

Our biggest cost is the newsletter. Though excellent, it is unaffordable. Now digitally composed it is sent to a printing/ mailing service. It did not

entice more memberships as hoped. We are trying to drastically cut it and other projected spending.

We face several options.

- For the rest of the season issue one newsletter to cover 3 or 4 months.
- Minimize the newsletter to a single sheet, prepared, copied, labeled, and mailed by a member volunteer who can exclusively devote time to this effort.
- Elicit member donations to provide a stake for next season.
- Consider that RESC is not viable; it needs financial help to continue.

We welcome recommendations and volunteers. Think this over; join in the solution.

Input is invited from volunteers who attend the next board meeting at the Unity Center on January 11, 2005 at 9:30 am. We need to resolve this in January.

The JTM Cafe is located in front of the newest building, the 80 foot high automated freezer warehouse. It is by far the tallest building in Harrison and probably most of Western Hills. The building, just completed this fall has the capability of storing pallet loads of frozen meats, frozen finished goods and other frozen food products for customers. Everything in the warehouse is controlled by computer to assure that the product is rotated properly and is delivered to the customer in good condition.

Before the tour we will view a short video that explains what happens at JTM. After the video we will tour the vestibule area of the automated freezer warehouse, where the stacker crane stages pallets being received and shipped. We will also see some of the manufacturing areas where the products are prepared and processed.

JTM is the fastest growing company in Harrison and one of the fastest growing companies in area. Please plan to join us for this tour. **Get your reservation in early as there will be a limit of 30 people.**

Directions to The Market Street Grille

From I-74 (West)

Take I-74 West to the New Haven Road Exit (Exit #1). Turn left (South) to Harrison Avenue. At Harrison turn right and follow it through old Harrison to Walnut Street. Market Street Grille will be on the right side at the corner of Walnut and Main Street (Harrison Avenue).

Directions to JTM Food Group From Market Street Grille

From Harrison and Walnut go West one block on Main Street to State Street. Turn left on State Street. Follow State approximately one mile to Campbell Road. Turn Left on Cambell Road. Turn left onto Industrial Drive, You will pass Sales Drive and a second building. Turn left just before the third building (the building with the red awnings) park your car and report to the JTM Cafe. The cafe is located inside the building with the red awnings.
