He has long been interested in Antarctica, having heard at age ten Admiral Byrd's lecture about his first two expeditions down there. He doesn't get seasick, a very welcome personal characteristic for Antarctic travel!

RESC DECEMBER TOUR TO TOYOTA, GEORGETOWN IS MEMORABLE

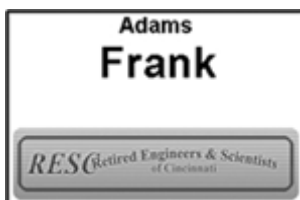

IMPORTANT PE INFORMATION

EVALUATING ACCEPTABLE CPD HOURS FOR OHIO P.E.'S

It is a continuing challenge to evaluate the content of RESC programs and be reasonably confident that they will qualify for CPD credit under the watchful eye of the Ohio Board. In 2008, there were over 6000 fewer registrations, primarily due to the requirement of 15 CPD credits. That translates to a loss to the Board of over \$120,000.

Since each P.E. has to evaluate the content of a program and decide for themselves if it qualifies for a CPD, here is the latest pronouncement from the Ohio State Board: "THE PURPOSE OF CONTINUING EDUCATION IS TO ENHANCE AND EXPAND YOUR SKILL, KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES AS A PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER"

Visit www.peps.ohio.gov for lists of a variety of activities that are acceptable and unacceptable for CPD credit. A registrant has six months to replace a CPD credit found unacceptable by the Ohio Board during an audit.
