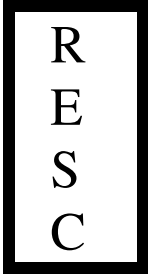


# RETIRED ENGINEERS AND SCIENTISTS OF CINCINNATI

### THE UNITED STATES MARSHALS SERVICE

The RESC speaker for May 15<sup>th</sup> is James M. Wahlrab, United States Marshal for the Southern District of Ohio since August 2, 2002. He is a native of Dayton, Ohio and attended the University of Dayton, Indiana State, Ohio State and the University of Cincinnati. He started his career with the Department of Justice as an intern and co-op student with the U.S. Marshals Service in 1974.

When we think of U.S. Marshals some think of the Marshals from the Wild West, but the U.S. Marshals of today are a far cry from that.

The organization came into being September 24, 1789. President George Washington appointed the first 13 U.S. Marshals following passage of the first Judiciary Act and it's the oldest federal law enforcement agency. The Marshals with headquarters in Arlington, Virginia, occupies a unique central position in the federal justice system. It is the enforcement arm of the federal courts, and as such is involved in virtually every federal law enforcement initiative.

**JUDICIAL SECURITY** - The USMS (United States Marshals Service) protects federal judicial officials which include judges, attorneys and jurors. (Continued on pg. 2, Marshals)

**FUGITIVE INVESTIGATIONS** - The USMS is the federal government's primary agency for conducting investigations. It arrests more federal fugitives than all other law enforcement agencies combined.

**SPECIAL MISSIONS AND PROGRAMS** - The USMS carries out hundreds of special missions each year that are related to its broad law enforcement and judicial security responsibilities.

**WITNESS SECURITY PROGRAM** - The USMS ensures the safety of witnesses who risk their lives to testify for the government including cases involving organized crime.

**PRISONER SERVICES** - The USMS currently houses approximately 54,000 federal detainees each day. Approximately 77 percent of USMS prisoners are housed in 1300 state, local and private jails.

**JUSTICE PRISONER AND ALIEN TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM (JPATS)** - In 1995 the air fleets of USMS and the Bureau of Immigration and Customs Enforcement merged to create the JPATS. On average, JPATS completes more than 305,000 prisoner and alien movements a year via coordinated air and group systems.
