## Meeting Highlights

Michael Dutle is a graduate of Thomas More College with a BA in English. He is currently the manager of the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP), a program of Family Service. Prior to this position he was formerly the Director of Education Services at the International Family Resource Center for Family Service. Mr. Dutle's background is in education, and management of education programs, with work in computer training and consulting. Michael worked in several departments of the Internal Revenue Service for over eight years, mainly in the Information Systems Department, the Problem Resolution Program and the Adjustments/Correspondence Division. Michael has been married for 33 years, and he and his wife have survived raising four children through their adolescent years.

**The Retired and Senior Volunteer Program** (RSVP) is part of Senior Corps, a network of national service programs that provides older Americans the opportunity to apply their life experience to meeting community needs. RSVP volunteers serve in a diverse range of nonprofit organizations, public agencies, and faith-based groups. Among other activities, they mentor at-risk youth, tutor elementary school age children, teach English to immigrants, and lend their business skills to community groups that provide critical social services. Nationally, in fiscal year 2001, approximately 480,000 volunteers served an average of four hours a week at an estimated 65,000 local organizations. Last year in Cincinnati, 409 volunteers gave 42,050 hours of service in 33 organizations.



## Tour Highlights

### About the Freedom Center

Located in Cincinnati, OH, the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center stands as the nation's newest monument to freedom. It brings to life the importance - and relevance - of struggles for freedom around the world and throughout history, including today. Made up of three buildings that symbolize the cornerstones of freedom - courage, cooperation, and perseverance - the Freedom Center's curving architecture reflects the winding river and the often-changing path to freedom.

### Why Cincinnati?

Now as in the past, Cincinnati's location on the Ohio River puts it at the crossroads of freedom's journey. In the 1800's the city served as a major hub of activity on the Underground Railroad and its banks offered refuge to thousands seeking hope and a new way of life. Today, as the home of the Freedom Center, it acts as a beacon of light once more.
