## FRANK DUVENECK & THE GOLDEN AGE OF CINCINNATI ART

CONNIE RAVE, DOCENT, CINCINNATI ART MUSEUM

Our speaker, Connie Rave, will speak on artists represented in the Cincinnati Wing of the museum, with an emphasis on Frank Duveneck and the Golden Age of Cincinnati art.

Cincinnati's most influential artist and teacher, Frank Duveneck was born in 1848, in Covington, Kentucky, where his parents ran a beer garden. His priceless paintings and artwork may be found in Fine Art Galleries throughout America, the Cathedral Basilica of the Assumption in Covington, the P. & G. home office, and even the Kenton County Library. While studying in Munich, Germany, he developed a progressive painting style characterized by broad, energetic brushstrokes. His success attracted younger painters, who became students, known as the Duveneck Boys. Following the sudden death of his wife, artist Elizabeth Boott, Duveneck returned to Cincinnati in 1890 to teach painting. He taught at the Art Academy of Cincinnati until his death in 1919.

**FRANK DUVENECK**

The rapid growth and expansion of Cincinnati from 1800 to 1820 contributed to development of the arts. In the forefront of the Industrial Revolution, by 1859, Cincinnati was the second largest manufacturing center in the United States. The wealth generated by industry led to patronage of individual artists and public art projects. After the Civil War the elevated importance of cultural pursuits led to the opening of several art institutions. Two of these centers, McMicken University, now the University of Cincinnati, and the McMicken School of Design, now the Art Academy of Cincinnati, still thrive today.

Connie Rave, wife of RESC member Joe Rave, has been a docent at the Cincinnati Art Museum for thirty-two years. In addition to conducting tours in the museum galleries, Connie has been active in the museum's Speaker's Bureau and Community Outreach programs as well as the Adopt-a-School Program.
